"I AM" NURSERY CURRICULUM

GOAL: TEACH THE CHILDREN WHO GOD SAYS THEY ARE

- This is a year long curriculum including 52 lessons, intended for ages 2-4.
- Lessons are short to accommodate little minds. They will focus on easy definitions and examples. Lessons are in italics and carry over into the craft/activity.
- Scriptures are listed at the top for reference, but you don't have to teach them to the kids. They're paraphrased in the lessons since our focus for this age group will not be memorization.

PLAN: SPEND TWO WEEKS ON EACH TRAIT

- Each trait has one lesson with two different crafts. Lessons will be repeated for two weeks. You can't repeat too much with toddlers, and you'll likely have different kids each week. If you want to change up the lesson for the second week, use it as a time to review and see what they remember.
- Asking who made them (God) and why (for His glory) are repeated weekly.
- The craft/activity will be different every week.
- Coloring pages are located in a separate document. There's two for each letter. You can use these as an alternative for something more simple. They're good for younger children, bigger groups, or an extra activity.

Weeks 1 & 2: I AM ALIVE

Scripture

But God, being rich in mercy, because of the great love with which he loved us, even when we were dead in our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ—by grace you have been saved—. **Ephesians 2:4-5**

Lesson

Who made you? (God made you.) And why did God make you? (For His glory!)

This week we're talking about how God made us ALIVE. He says that because he loves us, he made us alive together with Jesus.

Everybody breathe in. Now breathe out. Did you know we all have a heartbeat that allows us to breathe. God gives us the breath in our lungs so we can enjoy life with our families, friends and God himself. Everybody jump up and down a couple times. Now see if you can feel your heartbeat on your chest.

Craft/Activity Week 1

Today we're making hearts to remind us God loves us and made us alive.

Supplies

- Pipe cleaners
- Pony beads
- Container to hold beads
- String (optional)



Prep/Directions

Prep: Fold pipe cleaners into heart shapes with the opening at the top. Pour beads into a container.

Craft: Let the kids thread the beads onto the pipe cleaners. Some ages might need help. When they're done, twist the opening closed. You may need to leave the pipe cleaners straight for the little ones and shape them after.

Optional: Attach string to turn them into an ornament or a necklace.

Today we're painting with hearts to remind us God loves us and made us alive.

Supplies

- Toilet paper rolls or heart cookie cutters
- Tape or rubber bands
- Paint
- Paper
- Paint tray or paper plates
- Paint shirts



Prep/Directions

Prep: Make heart shapes out of toilet paper rolls. Use tape or rubber bands to hold them in place. Instead of making shapes, use heart shaped cookie cutters.

Craft: Put on paint shirts. Give everyone a heart shape and piece of paper. Put paint on a paint tray or paper plate. Let them dip and stamp their papers.

Weeks 3 & 4: I AM BOLD

Scripture

The wicked flee when no one pursues, but the righteous are bold as a lion. Proverbs 28:1

Lesson

Who made you? (God made you.) And why did God make you? (For His glory!)

This week we're talking about how God made us BOLD. He says that we are bold as a lion. We all get scared sometimes. Are there any things that make you scared?

Did you know that because we have God, we don't have to be afraid. He made us courageous.

Everybody roar like a lion.

Craft/Activity Week 1

Today we're making lion masks so we can remember we're bold and brave.

Supplies

- Paper plates
- Scissors
- Strips of yellow & orange construction paper
- Giant popsicle sticks
- Hot glue
- Bottled glue or double-sided tape



Prep/Directions

Prep: Cut holes in paper plates. Hot glue popsicle sticks to paper plates. Cut strips of orange and yellow paper in various lengths. If using double-sided tape attach it to the plates before you begin.

Craft: Have kids attach strips onto the plate.

Today we're painting lion manes to remind us that we are bold and brave.

Supplies

- Paper
- Black sharpie or marker
- Orange paint
- Paper plate or paint tray
- Paint shirt
- Plastic forks
- Large googly eyes



Prep/Directions

Prep: Trace circles and draw noses and mouths on paper. Glue on eyes. If kids are older, you can let them trace their own circles with a round object and glue on their own eyes.

Craft: Put paint on a paper plate or paint tray. Give the kids a fork. Demonstrate/let them paint the mane on their lions.

Weeks 5 & 6: I AM CHOSEN

Scripture

But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people for his own possession, that you may proclaim the excellencies of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light. 1 Peter 2:9

Lesson

Who made you? (God made you.) And why did God make you? (For His glory!)

This week we're talking about how God CHOSE us. He says that we are a chosen people made to show everybody that He is good.

He chose me to be me and you to be you. He gave me (ex. blonde hair and hazel eyes) and put me in a family with (ex. my mom, dad, and two brothers). Let's figure out what color eyes and hair God gave us. (Have them go around the table and decide on each others' hair and eye color.) Who are some of the people in your family? (Let them name some.) God also chose them and made them amazing just like us.

Craft/Activity Week 1

Today we're going to trace our outlines and decorate them to see how unique we all are.

**This activity is planned for outdoors. If the weather does not permit, use paper instead.

Supplies

- Chalk
- For indoors: paper roll, markers, crayons, paint





Prep/Directions

Prep: If doing the activity indoors, set up paper, paint, crayons, and/or markers.

Craft: Trace each kid's outline. Let them color/decorate however they want.

Today we're making bees to remind us that God chose us to be ourselves and no one else. By being ourselves, we proclaim his goodness.

Supplies

- Cardboard
- Yarn
- Paper (for wings)
- Googly eyes
- Popsicle sticks
- Hot glue
- Scissors



Prep/Directions

Prep: Cut cardboard in circles and make slits for yarn. Cut out wings. Glue on the popsicle sticks first to make it easier for them to hold.

Craft: Cut a strip of yarn. Tie it around the cardboard in the slits. (This can be a part of the prep.) Have the kids continue to wrap it around the cardboard. When they're done with, tie it off and let them add more colors until they're done. Glue on the eyes and wings for them.

Weeks 7 & 8: I AM DESTINED

Scripture

For God has not destined us for wrath, but to obtain salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ, who died for us so that whether we are awake or asleep we might live with him. 1 Thessalonians 5:9-10

Lesson

Who made you? (God made you.) And why did God make you? (For His glory!)

This week we're talking about how God DESTINED us. He says that we are destined for salvation. Salvation is a gift from God so we can choose to follow Jesus. Does anyone know who died for our sins? God sent Jesus to die on the cross for our sins. But he also raised Jesus from the dead so we could know Him. When we know Jesus and choose to believe in Him, we can live with Him forever.

Craft/Activity Week 1

Today we're painting with marbles to remind us that we are all on a different journey. Each marble will take a different path. Our lives are unique, but God is with us wherever we go.

Supplies

- Paint
- Marbles
- Cups
- Spoons
- Cardboard Box(es)
- Paper



Prep/Directions

Prep: Find a cardboard box with no openings on the bottom and cut down the edges if needed.

Craft: Pour some paint in cups. Drop the marbles in them. Line box with a piece of paper. Let the kids choose several colors/marbles. Scoop them into the box. Help them roll it around. If you have two adults you can have two boxes going at once, but this activity will be best if the kids take turns. Remind them to be gentle and keep the marbles in the box.

Today we're making binoculars to remind us that life is an adventure, but wherever we go, God is with us and wants us to know Him. When we look for Him, He will always be there.

Supplies

- Cardstock or toilet paper rolls
- String or ribbon
- Hole punch
- Hot glue
- Markers
- Stickers



Prep/Directions

Prep: Cut a piece of cardstock in half and roll it into tubes. Secure with hot glue and attach the tubes together to create a pair of binoculars. If using toilet paper rolls, consider gluing white paper around them to create a better craft surface. Punch holes for the string and tie off.

Craft: Let the children decorate their pair.

Weeks 9 & 10: I AM ENCOURAGING

Scripture

Therefore encourage one another and build one another up, just as you are doing. 1 Thessalonians 5:11

Lesson

Who made you? (God made you.) And why did God make you? (For His glory!)

This week we're talking about how God made us ENCOURAGERS. He says that we should encourage one another and build each other up. Does anyone know what encourage means? (Let them answer.) It means that we are kind with our words and actions and that we look out for and help each other. What are some ways that we can be kind and help each other? (Ex. sharing, helping each other when we fall down, saying kind things, etc.)

Craft/Activity Week 1

Today we're going to encourage each other by saying kind things.

Supplies


- Copies of Cloud Template (next page)
 - cardstock works best but regular paper is fine
- Scissors
- Hole punch
- Glue
- Cotton balls
- Watercolor paint
- Permanent marker



Prep/Directions

Prep: Cut out the template and glue together. Punch a hole in the top.

Craft: Write each child's name on their cloud. Start with one child at a time. Have everyone name something nice about them. Write these on their clouds with a permanent marker.. Once everyone's cloud is complete, let them glue cotton balls onto the cloud then use watercolor paint. Feel free to skip the cotton balls and just use watercolors.



Today we're going to make a postcard with an encouraging note to send to someone.

Supplies

- Copies of Postcard Template (next page) on cardstock
- Watercolor paint, markers, crayons, stickers
- Permanent marker or pen



Prep/Directions

Prep: Print copies of the postcard template on cardstock. You just need to print the back side.. The front will be a blank canvas for the kids. Cut them out.

Craft: Help each kid write something encouraging and sign their name. Keep it short (Ex. You are loved.). Let the kids paint or color the front of their postcards. You can leave the address blank and let them take it home to fill out.

Weeks 11 & 12: I AM FREE

Scripture

For freedom Christ has set us free; stand firm therefore, and do not submit again to a yoke of slavery. **Galatians 5:1**

Lesson

Who made you? (God made you.) And why did God make you? (For His glory!)

This week we're talking about how God made us FREE. He wants us to live a life of freedom so other people can be free as well. When we are free, we are no longer guilty of our sins. That means when we do something wrong, we can make it right again. When Jesus died on the cross for us and arose from the dead, God forgave us for all the wrong things we could ever do. When we are forgiven and free, we can be ourselves.

Croft/Activity Week 1

Today we're making birds. Just like birds can fly anywhere they want to, we are free to be ourselves anywhere we go. When we are free, we can help others.

Supplies

- Construction paper
- Pencils
- Scissors
- Googly eyes
- Glue sticks
- Glue for eyes



Prep/Directions

Prep: Cut out beaks and feet.

Craft: Give everyone paper and a pencil. Help them trace their hands and cut them out. Glue on beaks, feet, and eyes.

Today we're making kites to remind us that we're free to be ourselves anywhere we go. When we are free, we can help others.

Supplies

- Paper bags
- Stickers
- Markers
- Party streamers/crepe paper
- String
- Scissors
- Tape



Prep/Directions

Prep: Cut string into strips (not too long or it's hard to fly). Tape the string inside the open end of the bag near the opening. Cut crepe paper in various colors and lengths.

Craft: Let the kids decorate their paper bags. Have them pick a few streamers and tape them onto the closed end of the bag (not the open end). If the weather is nice, let them run around outside. When the open end catches the wind, it will 'fly'. If the weather isn't nice, let them run around inside. They will still have fun.

Weeks 13 & 14: I AM GENTLE

Scripture

Remind them to be submissive to rulers and authorities, to be obedient, to be ready for every good work, to speak evil of no one, to avoid quarreling, to be gentle, and to show perfect courtesy toward all people. Titus 3:1-2

Lesson

Who made you? (God made you.) And why did God make you? (For His glory!)

This week we're talking about how God made us GENTLE. He says He wants us to be gentle with our words and actions towards all people.

Has anyone ever said something to you that made you sad? Has anyone gotten pushed and it hurt? It's important to be gentle so everyone is respected and we don't hurt our friends. Being gentle is being calm, kind, and helpful not just with our actions but also our words.

Can you think of any ways to be gentle? (Ex. Sharing toys, giving someone a hug, helping with chores, saying kind words not hurtful ones)

Craft/Activity Week 1

Today we're going to decorate some noise makers to remind us that our words and actions are like noise. We can choose if they're loud and mean or gentle and loving.

Supplies

- Paper plates
- Dry beans or dry pasta
- Markers
- Stickers
- Party streamers/crepe paper (optional)
- Stapler or hot glue



Prep/Directions

Craft: Give everyone a plate and let them decorate it. Once done help them fold it in half then place some beans or pasta inside. Staple or glue closed. Play some music and let them use their noise makers.

Everybody take a feather. Now rub it on your cheek to see how soft it is. Today, we're going to use feathers as a paintbrush to remind us that we are gentle.

Supplies

- Feathers
- Paint
- Paint shirts
- Paper
- Paint tray or paper plates



Prep/Directions

Craft: Put on paint shirts. Give each kid a piece of paper. Pour different colors of paint onto a paint tray or paper plate. Let them paint.

Weeks 15 & 16: I AM HOPEFUL

Scripture

May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that by the power of the Holy Spirit you may abound in hope. Romans 15:13

Lesson

Who made you? (God made you.) And why did God make you? (For His glory!)

This week we're talking about how God made us HOPEFUL. He says that by the power of the Holy Spirit, we overflow with hope. Having hope in God means that we can be victorious in any situation. He will provide whatever we need.

Has anyone ever said they can't do something? Everyone feels like that sometimes, but it's important to always try. When we are hopeful, we can be sure that God knows just what we need. We can always look to him for help to stay positive in every situation.

Craft/Activity Week 1

Today, we're making waterfalls to remind us that God made us to overflow. Whatever we need, He will provide in abundance so we can be hope to those around us. We can overflow with joy, peace, hope, kindness and strength.

Supplies

- Water
- Paint
- Cups
- Pipettes
- Cardstock (paper can be used but it doesn't hold up as well to water)



Prep/Directions

Prep: Thin paint with water in cups. Add the pipettes.

Craft: Give everyone a sheet of paper. Help the kids use the pipette to put drops on their paper. When they're done help them lean it over the trash can and watch the drops fall. You can layer some paper towels in the trash first to help soak up the water. Lay flat to dry.

Has anyone ever seen a rainbow in the sky? Rainbows are a reminder from God that he's always there for us. Today, we're going to make a rainbow cloud in a jar to remind us that God is always there to help us. We can be hopeful because He loves us and will always provide what we need. When we trust God and His promises, we are hope to others.

Supplies

- Pitchers of water
- Mason jars
- Shaving cream (foam kind)
- Food coloring (not gel food coloring)



Prep/Directions

Activity: Give each kid a mason jar. Help them fill up their jars with water one at a time (leave about two inches of room at the top for the cloud). Remind them that it's like how God fills them up with what they need. Help them spray a layer of shaving cream in the jar. This is the cloud. Talk about how sometimes things happen in life that make it hard for us to be positive. Things get cloudy and we might get sad or mad and not be able to see that God is there for us. Now let them drop some different colors in their jar. Talk about how if we're patient, we will always see God move. He will give us joy and peace even through the hard cloudy times. This is hope.

This week we're talking about how God INCLUDES us. He says when we hear His truth and believe in Jesus, He gives us the Holy Spirit. This includes us in Jesus, which means we become His family.

Has anyone ever felt alone? Did you know that even when you feel lonely, God is always with you.

Craft/Activity Week 1

Today we're going to make glasses to remind us that even though we can't see God, He is always with us. He doesn't want us to feel alone. He made us so we can belong with Him.

Supplies

- Glasses Template (next page)
- Cardstock
- Markers
- Scissors
- Tape or stapler




Prep/Directions

Prep: Make copies of template on cardstock

Craft: Let the kids color their glasses. Cut them out for them once finished. Tape or staple the pieces together.

Supplies

- Tree Template (next page)
- Paper
- Pen
- Washable markers or washable stamp pad



Prep/Directions

Prep: Make a copy of the tree template.

Craft: Have the kids pick a color marker. It's okay if some want the same. Help them color one of their thumbs. It will be best to have one child make a print at a time. Put their thumbprint on the tree. Write their name by it. Once done, choose a place to hang it.

Who made you? (God made you.) And why did God make you? (For His glory!)

This week we're talking about how God made us JOYFUL. He says we can be filled with joy because He has done great things for us. He also says that no one can take our joy away from us. This means that even if we're frustrated or mad we can always choose to be joyful instead. God has given us joy and it's our choice to let it show.

Craft/Activity Week 1

Today we're making marshmallow smiles to remind us that we can always choose to be joyful even if we're sad or frustrated about something.

Supplies

- Red construction paper
- Pencil
- Giant popsicle sticks
- Mini marshmallows
- Bottled glue



Prep/Directions

Prep: Cut mouth shapes out of paper. Mark lines for the teeth. Glue on popsicle sticks.

Craft: Let the kids glue marshmallows onto the guidelines. Let dry completely before sending home. Enjoy a tasty treat when they're done!

Today we're making sharks. When they open their mouths, their sharp teeth make them look like they're smiling all the time. We can also choose to be joyful no matter what even when we feel sad or mad. Choosing joy can change our attitude and our whole day.

Supplies

- Popsicles sticks
- Googly eyes
- Glue
- Blue paint or markers
- Blue construction paper
- White paper
- Hot glue



Prep/Directions

Prep: Cut tails and fins out of blue paper. Cut teeth out of white paper. Use hot glue to glue popsicle sticks into triangles.

Craft: Let the kids color their sharks. Help them glue on the fins, tail, teeth and eye. Let them dry completely before sending home.

Weeks 21 & 22: I AM KIND

Scripture

This week we're talking about how God made us KIND. He says we are kind and tenderhearted so we can forgive others like He forgives us. When we are kind, we show people they matter.

Craft/Activity Week 1

Today we're going to talk about kindness with apples.

Supplies

- 2 Apples
- Knife
- Cutting board



Prep/Directions

Prep: Take one apple and drop it several times to bruise it. We will treat one nicely and treat one badly. At the end, we will cut them open to compare.

Activity: I want you to look at these two apples. What color are they? They look pretty similar, but I don't like this apple. I think it's mean and ugly. We're so different and they don't share their toys. Since I don't like it, I don't think you should like it. Here, catch it. (Throw it to someone. It's okay if they drop it, more bruises. Some kids may tell you to be nice or be shocked, but if they will, have them say something mean. Now take the second apple.) I like this apple. I think it's beautiful and kind. I like to play with this one because we like the same things. Let's be gentle and say something nice to it. Now let's cut open the apples and see what happened. (Talk about how it's important to be kind because when we're not, we hurt others. From the outside we might look okay, but on the inside we aren't.)

Supplies

- Apples
- Paint
- Paper plates
- Paper
- Paint shirts



Prep/Directions

Prep: Cut the apples right before. Cut some horizontal and some vertical so there's different 'shapes'.

Craft: Put on paint shirts. Give each kid a paper plate and piece of paper. Give two different halves to each kid. Put paint on their plate, and let them make prints with the apples.

Weeks 23 & 24: I AM LOVE

Scripture

But God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us.

Lesson

Who made you? (God made you.) And why did God make you? (For His glory!)

This week we're talking about how God LOVES us. He showed us His love, by sending Jesus to die for us on the cross for our sins. But God also raised Jesus from the dead so we can live forever with Him. Since we are LOVED by God, we can LOVE others no matter who they are, even if they are different than us.

Croft/Activity Week 1

Who knows what shape reminds us of love? Hearts! Today we're decorating some hearts.

Supplies

- Coffee filters
- Scissors
- Washable markers (permanent markers won't work)
- Spray bottles
- Water
- Towel



Prep/Directions

Prep: Fill spray bottles with water. Cut the filters into hearts. (It will be easiest if you fold them in half then cut half the shape. You should be able to cut several at a time.)

Craft/Activity Week 1

Today we're going to melt some ice to remind us that when God forgives us, our sins disappear from His mind just like the ice will disappear. (This is a great outdoor activity.)

Supplies

- Small plastic toys
- Different size plastic containers
- Water
- Freezer
- Food coloring (optional)
- Large plastic tub
- Spray bottles, squirt bottles, cups and/or turkey basters
- Water



Prep/Directions

Prep: Fill plastic containers with water and some toys. Add food coloring, mix and freeze overnight. This activity can be done outside. Instead of using a large tub to hold them, place them on the sidewalk. Fill spray bottles and cups with water.

Activity: Put the frozen blocks into the large tub. You can leave them in the containers and empty them as they melt. Let the children use water to melt the ice and reveal the toys.

Prep/Directions



Supplies


- Traffic Light Template (next page)

- Glue sticks





Craft/Activity Week 1

Today we're making giraffes. They're really tall so you have to look up high to see them. It will remind us that even though we're young, we are people others can look up to as a good example.

Supplies

- Yellow construction paper
- Black paper
- Scissors
- Googly eyes
- Bottled glue
- Brown paint
- Paper plate or paint tray
- Paint shirts
- Black marker
- Pencil



Prep/Directions

Prep: Cut small black circles out of paper.

Craft: Put on paint shirts. Trace their hands and arm starting at the top of the yellow paper so you can make the neck as long as possible. Cut them out. Draw the smile and nose then glue on the eyes and ossicones (antlers). Put some brown paint on a paint tray. Let them use their fingers to paint the spots.

Today we're painting airplanes. Since you have to look up in the sky to see them, it will remind us that others can look up to us to be a good example.

Supplies

- Clothespins
- Giant popsicle sticks
- Popsicle sticks
- Hot glue
- Watercolors



Prep/Directions

Prep: Use hot glue to glue two giant popsicle sticks on either side of the front end (where it opens) of a clothespin. Glue one regular popsicle stick to the top back end of the clothespin.

Craft: Let the kids paint their airplanes with watercolors.

Weeks 51 & 52: I AM ZEALOUS

Scripture

Those whom I love, I reprove and discipline, so be zealous and repent. Revelation 3:19

Lesson

Who made you? (God made you.) And why did God make you? (For His glory!)

This week we're talking about how GOD made us ZEALOUS. He said we should be full of zeal for good and if we're wrong, repent. That means we should strive to be good in all we do, but when we realize we've done something wrong, we should make it right and ask for forgiveness.

We can be good by being all the things God has made us to be. Can you remember any of the things we've talked about? (See if they can name some.) Being loving, kind, gentle, and merciful are some other ways we can be good. Being zealous also means we are excited about doing God's work.

Craft/Activity Week 1

Today we're making name rockets to remind us that we can burst with excitement about God's goodness just like rockets rockets burst into the air with flames.

Supplies

- Construction paper
- Scissors
- Glue
- Star stickers (optional)



Prep/Directions

Prep: Cut different color squares and triangles. Cut yellow rectangles.

Craft: Help the kids count out the squares needed to spell their names. Help them glue them down. Write the letters of their name for them. Help them glue the triangle tops and rectangle flames. If using star stickers, let them put them wherever.

Today we're making volcanoes erupt to remind us that we can also explode with God's goodness.

Supplies

- Gallon ziploc bag
- Red and yellow paint
- Brown construction paper
- Double-sided tape
- Masking tape
- Painter's tape (optional)
- Regular tape



Prep/Directions

Prep: Cut volcano shapes out of brown paper. Attach these to the outside of the bag with double-sided tape. Put some red and yellow paint in the bag behind the volcano. Make sure the bags are sealed and used masking tape over it.

Activity: If you want, you can attach the bags to the table with painters tape to keep them stationary. Let the kids push the paint around until they're done. It will be best to just toss it when they're finished. If they want to keep it, tape the seal so they can't undo it!:
