JOB CREATION:

Because our currency is so weak against the Dollar, we get so much more from it than you would in the USA. We are currently employing so many people and give God the glory that each of them have an income where they had none at first.







Working in your community and FOR your community! Here are some of our permanent workers. They live in Amatola Crescent. The payment they receive from us is their permanent income.

SCHOOL:

We are busy erecting a building that will serve as a Day-Care for pre-school children as well as an After-school programme to help with homework and extra classes.









We use recycles wood pallets to build every structure. Although laboursome and a bit more time consuming, this is the best material for cost effectiveness. As with all the structures be erect it has a solid concrete foundation and powerful

pillars to withstand any storm.

The children are so very excited about their new school and cannot wait for it to be finished!

FEEDING PROJECT:

Keeping tummies full is a very important part of our ministry in the community of Claremont and we do our best to have regular feeding schemes. We also make sure the households have what they need to keep their families fed.

Instead of only feeding by means of a Soup Kitchen, our focus is more on self sustainable projects such as job creation where provide a salary for those who work in the community itself as well as creating Small Business. These include the following:

TUCK SHOP

We are employing two ladies who sell french fries and a small variety of foods for a profit. This money goes into paying their salaries and in support of the work in the community.

SMALL SHOPS

In an effort of empowering the people in Amatola Crescent to be more self-reliant and have better living circumstances, we are investing the financial start and assisting them with setting up a proper cost and profit flow for individual businesses. Some sell sweets from their homes, some baked goods, some produce flip-flops etc. By doing this, we are keeping the money inside the community because everyone supports one another. We make sure that there's a descent balance and no competition between the small little businesses. Everyone is excited about these endeavours and the shops are even drawing business from the outside.

COMMUNITY NEWSLETTER:

One way and probably the most important way of drawing the people towards the same goal of upliftment is communication. It is crucial that everyone in the community knows what's going on and we have an open book policy. So instead of just sending out flyers, we have started distributing a small community Newsletter where we advertise all the little businesses as well as everything we are doing and all our plans for community upliftment and empowerment. This way no-one stays oblivious and all can be actively involved.

SAFETY & SECURITY:

The well-being of the people within the confines of the wall we built is very important to us and therefore we had to put a few programmes in place. We employed a man from the community to serve as a night watch security guard; he does regular patrols in and around the wall every night. He makes sure that those who come home during the night are safe and that no suspicious people climb overy the walls. Drugs used to be sold on a regular basis there, but our security guard is doing his job! We also erected eight surveillance cameras so that all possible illegal activity can be recorded and monitored.

The new Station Commander of our local Police Precinct recently visited our office and we are glad to say that we have a good and solid relationship with the SAPS. They do regular patrols in the area and drug busts have become a regular occurance.

MORE PROJECTS...

THERE IS JUST SO MUCH TO DO!!! In a community such as this, there is always more to do every day and the work never stops. Amada's Office gets flooded with people coming in and out asking for help and advice, prayer and counseling. Our goal is to get as many souls saved as we can through showing the love of Christ Jesus. We have already laid the foundation for yet another little building for a YOUTH CENTRE where we will house the Youth on A Friday night. This effort will help keep them off the street and invest a strong sense of relationship with Jesus into their young lives. **GLORY TO THE THE LORD!**

He has done great things and more is yet to come!! We cannot thank you enough for your kind support with our work in this community as well as your prayers.
